A [Call for Papers](#) has been issued for CLADEA 2011 XLVI Annual Assembly, to be held October 20-23 in San Juan. The conference theme is “Innovation and Entrepreneurial Development: The Economic Future of Latin America.” Papers may be submitted in Spanish, Portuguese, or English. Text, quotes and bibliographic references must follow style guidelines established by the *American Psychological Association (APA) 6th edition*. Papers will be reviewed by scholars in each track under a blind review process.

To personally present a paper and have it included in the conference proceedings publication, at least one of the authors must be duly [registered](#) to attend the CLADEA 2011 Annual Conference and have paid the corresponding registration fee. The presented papers may be considered for publication on a special issue of *ACADEMIA*. The papers must be unpublished and must relate directly to one of the following tracks:

3. Management and Operations Management
4. Economic Policies and Economic Development
5. Human Resources and Business Social Responsibility
6. Accounting and Finance
7. Marketing and Sales

All events were hosted by the [Graduate Business School, University of Cape Town \(GBS\)](#).
